

## JURY UPHOLDS WILL OF GREAT NECK MAN

**Jennie Zweifel, His Niece, Objected To Second Document, Claiming Fraud, Undue Influence**

The will of Matthew Greer of Great Neck, who died May 12, was upheld by a jury before Surrogate Leone D. Howell yesterday. The estate is valued at about \$9,000.

Objections to the will were entered by Jennie Zweifel, a niece. She was sole beneficiary of the testator's first will, dated June 10, 1935, but was cut off in his second will, dated March 12, 1936.

She contended that the will was executed through fraud and undue influence and that the signature was not that of Greer. Albert S. Osborn, widely known handwriting expert, testified that in his opinion the handwriting in the second will was not that of Greer.

The second will, now probated, gave the entire estate to his sister, Mrs. Sarah Mahan of Great Neck and her daughter, Mrs. Henrietta Leach, who was named executrix. John J. Britton, a neighbor of the testator, told the court that he visited Greer a short time after the second will was made. He said that Greer told him that he (Greer) had signed the document.
